






Minivan Manhood—NEW RELEASE OCTOBER 2023





Finding God in the Darkness



"Make it your ambition to lead a quiet life," Paul urges (1 Thess. 4:11 NIV). Those words have become almost a mantra for me, says Chad Bird. "Make it your ambition to lead a quiet life." In other words, make it your ambition not to let "awesome" define your life, dictate your relationships, weigh the importance of who you are, or guide you in discerning how and where God is found. To lead a quiet life doesn't mean that you lower your expectations as much as you lower your gaze. Instead of looking up to the next accomplishment, the next rung on the ladder, you look down at the daily life you live, the children God has given you, the spouse by your side, your aging parents, your dear friends, the poor and needy—all those "little things" you miss when you're always looking up to the "next big thing" in your life.

Likewise, instead of looking up for God in emotionally electrifying mountaintop experiences, you'll discover he is the Lord of the lowlands, transfigured by simplicity and suffering. He prefers to sit with the lonely, weep with the mourner, and wander the halls of the ICU. Instead of looking for God in the high and mighty things of this world, you'll find him tucked into the smallest crevices of life: swimming in the tears of the widow, enthroned upon a quarter-sized piece of bread from the altar, laughing in the toddler's voice as he plays in the sandbox. Instead of waiting to be wowed by God in mighty displays of his omnipotence, you'll find that power compressed into weak, unimpressive vessels.

Be Thou my Song is a line from seventeenth-century poet Edward Taylor.
